Kerriann Flanagan Brosky, author of “Ghosts of Long Island: Stories of the Paranormal,” is a Long Island historian, writer, photographer and artist. In this, her highly anticipated third book, Ms. Brosky draws upon her long-standing interest in local history and combines with it her estimable writing and photography talents.

Ms. Brosky, a magna cum laude graduate of Long Island University at C.W. Post, studied under renowned photographer Arthur Leipzig. She began her career in 1990 as a photojournalist at *Newsday* and other Long Island publications. In 1992 she started Portraits By Kerriann, creating hand-colored photographs – personal portraits of individuals, pets, families and homes – while continuing freelance photography and public relations.

In her previous books, published in 1995 and 1997, Ms. Brosky combined her research and writing on Huntington history with photography, as well as her growing interest in the paranormal.

Ms. Brosky is a sought-after and frequent lecturer on the history of the Town of Huntington as well Long Island’s haunted locations, which she began investigating more than a decade ago. She served for six years as vice president of the board of trustees of the Huntington Historical Society and also served three years as a member of the board of the Greenlawn-Centerport Historical Association.

A Long Island native, Ms. Brosky lives in Huntington.
